## Who can participate?

- 4-H Dog Care \& Training youth members and 4-H Seeing Eye Puppy-Raising Project youth members who meet the state requirements of "member in good standing"
- Non-4-H members of The Seeing Eye Puppy Raising Program (both Youth and Adult) may participate in Seeing Eye Activities.


## What is a 4-H "Member in Good Standing"?

ALL 4-H youth participants (grades $4^{\text {th }}$ and up) must meet the NJ 4-H "member in good standing" requirements which include:

1. Currently registered in 4HOnline as of January 1, 2024.
2. Has attended $70 \%$ of club meetings/activities.
3. Has given a presentation at the club level or higher.
4. Has an up-to-date 4-H dog project/Seeing Eye record book.
*Youth who do not meet these requirements may show For Exhibition Only (FEO)*

- Discuss the appropriate classes for you and your dog.

## Club Leaders

Once the State Dog Show Committee receives the completed entry an email will be sent to each club's contact person.

- Review entry/entries and reply back confirming the information or providing edits as needed.
- Pay particular attention to:
- Whether the dog entered is a 4-H project dog or Seeing Eye puppy.
- Vaccinations are up to date to the best of your knowledge.
- Classes and levels are correct for the dog and handler.
- Collect Payment and Permission forms (both Youth and Adult) for all club participants.
- Send single packet with all Permission forms and a single check to cover your clubs entry fees.
- Checks payable to "NJ 4-H Dog PAC"
- NOTE: Withdrawn Entries after May 24th cannot be refunded

| Agility - \$5.00 / Dog <br> 4-H dog project members grades 4 and up <br> Dogs race against a clock as they navigate an obstacle course with strong concentration and speed <br> Beginner - non-competitive, on lead - best suited for dogs with little/no agility experience. <br> On Lead - best suited for dogs with some agility experience. <br> Off Lead - for the dog and handler with agility experience | Rally - \$5.00 / Dog <br> $4-\mathrm{H}$ dog project members grades $4^{\text {th }}$ and up <br> You and your dog navigate a course, side-byside, as you steer him through a course of 1020 different signs. Each of these signs provides instructions regarding the next skill that is to be performed. <br> Select the safest option based on the dog's size and ability. <br> - Rally Novice - on lead <br> - Rally Advanced A - on lead <br> - Rally Advanced B - off lead <br> Jump heights available from 4"-20" for Advanced level |



## Explanation of Junior Showmanship Classes

Beginner class: all grades (formerly First Year) Anyone who does not want to compete can enter this class. Participation rosette to all entrants. Non-competitive, constructive class.

Junior class 4th -6th grades: Equivalent to AKC Junior Classes
Novice: for those who have not yet received 3 PLACINGS in this class
Open: for those who have 3 or more $1^{\text {st }}-4^{\text {th }}$ PLACINGS (does not need to be in 1 calendar year) in the 4-H Junior level or have shown in an AKC Novice Junior class

Master: for those who have shown at the AKC Open level, or have won 3 Best Junior Handler awards at 4-H shows (formerly 4-H Advanced class)

Intermediate class 7th to 9th grade: Equivalent to AKC Intermediate classes
Novice: for those who have not yet received $31^{\text {st }}-4^{\text {th }}$ PLACINGS in this class Open: for those who have 3 or more $1^{\text {st }}-4^{\text {th }}$ PLACINGS, OR are moving up to the Intermediate grade group from the 4-H Open Junior class, or have shown in an Novice Intermediate class at an AKC show

Master: for those who have shown at the AKC Open level, or have won 3 Best Junior Handler awards at 4-H shows (formerly 4-H Advanced class)

Senior class 10th -13th grade: Equivalent to AKC Senior class
Novice: for those who have not yet received $31^{\text {st }}-4^{\text {th }}$ PLACINGS in this class
Open: for those who have had 3 or more $1^{\text {st }}-4^{\text {th }}$ PLACINGS, OR are moving up to the $4-\mathrm{H}$ Senior grade group from the $4-\mathrm{H}$ Open Intermediate class, or have shown at the Novice Senior level at an AKC show

Master: for those who have shown at the AKC Open level, or have won 3 Best Junior Handler awards at 4-H shows (formerly 4-H Advanced class)

## Best Junior Handler classes are determined as follows:

Best Novice - Determined from the First Place winners from Novice Classes:
Jr. Novice, Int. Novice, Sr. Novice
Best Open - Determined From the First Place winners from Open Classes: Jr. Open, Int. Open, Sr. Open
Best Master - Determined from the First Place winners from Master Classes: Jr. Master, Int. Master, Sr. Master
